

2010 NAFL Summer Meetings Voting Proposals

Nine owners voted, 1 commissioner and 1 secretary = Total – 11 votes

Issue – League Finances

League finances and prize money could be enhanced further since we only 12 teams and award owners who have a good year.

Proposal A – Raise the Annual League Fee and award more Prize Money

Increase the prize fund to award owners more money that have a good year by raising the annual league fee to \$115. Breakdown of \$15 per owner creates additional \$180 with \$160 going to the Weekly Fund and \$20 going towards Post-Season Fund/

The extra \$15 will go towards the following:

WEEKLY – Total Fund increases by \$160 to a total of \$678.00

- Return of weekly third place \$5 thru playoffs. $17 \times \$5 = \85
- Return of weekly 1st & 2nd prize \$ thru playoffs $3 \times \$25 = \75

POST-SEASON – Total Fund increases by \$20 to a total of \$558

Increase the amount to the NAFL Champion by \$20.

- NAFL CHAMPION-\$170

Yes - 5

No – 6 = Did not Pass

Issue – Roster Size and Scoring

Owners need to decide if roster sizes and/or limitations need to be changed and if scoring options need to be added.

Proposal B – Decrease the total number on a NAFL Roster to 15.

NAFL rosters are too big and limits the number of players that teams can pick up during the year. Often teams hide players on rosters to limit other teams to get them. Every team should have the same chance to win.

By limiting a roster to 15 the following will occur.

Starting lineups would still consist of 8 players, 1 head coach and 1 defense.

1 additional defense on roster.

1 additional QB on roster

3 back-up players

Proposal C- Change submission of Back-ups

Change the way owners submit back-ups in order to break ties.

Owners will no longer need to submit back-up players. Back-up players will automatically be ranked each week in order by WebCommissioner

1. QB
2. RB
3. WR
4. TE
5. K
6. DT

No – 7 = Did not Pass

Proposal D – Add an Offensive Team Position to the roster

Add an Offensive Team category or offensive coordinator to the roster. Owners would draft and NFL Offensive Team to have on their team. Points would be awarded based on the number of points the NFL Team scores or 1 point per 7 pts the NFL team scores. Rosters would be increased by one position to allow for the new position (Note: if Proposal B passes the roster size would be increased to 16). No points would be awarded during bye weeks and offensive teams cannot be kept as a franchise player.

Yes - 3

No – 8 = Did not Pass

Proposal E – Award points for the number of receptions a player completes

Award points to players for the number of receptions they make during the game. Players currently do not get awarded for making key plays and first downs and possession receivers play an important part of the game. One point per 5 receptions would be awarded to the player and to the team.

Yes - 4

Issue – Transactions

Owners need to decide if transaction limitations need to be changed.

Proposal F – Change the limit on the number of Transactions

Instead of limiting the number of transactions a team can make per week, only limit the **total number** of free agent transactions a team can make. ***The total number of free agent transactions (ADD's) a team could make in a year would be 23.*** This will allow a team to make as many transactions they want in a given week as long as they do not go over a total number of free agent transactions (ADD's) made per year. Once a team meets the maximum the team will not be able to make any no more free-agent transactions (ADD's). Taking players on and off IR would not count as a transaction. Transaction deadline still applies and emergency transactions are only allowed after deadline if a team

can not start a QB, K or a TE. The number of transactions would be tracked in WebCommissioner. Below is a breakdown of the total number of transactions proposed:

11 weeks of free-agent transactions x 2 per week = 22

1 additional emergency transaction = 1

Total = 23 transactions per year.
