

## **2011 NAFL Summer Meetings Voting Proposals**

### **Issue – Scoring**

Owners need to decide if the league should add more scoring options.

#### Proposal A – Add Offensive Team Scoring

Add an additional scoring element to the Head Coach position to account for an Offensive Coordinator by allowing for offensive team scoring. This would be similar to defensive team scoring which awards points based on a scale. If the Head Coach / Offensive Coordinator's team scores then points will be awarded to the Head Coach / Offensive Coordinator. Therefore the more points the Head Coach / Offensive Coordinator's team scores the more points are awarded to your franchise. Below is the suggested breakdown.

10 - 14 pts = 1 pt  
15 - 19 pts = 2 pts  
20 - 24 pts = 3 pts  
25 or more = 4 pts

#### Proposal B – Scoring changes after Monday Night

During the season, the NFL often makes scoring changes that could affect scoring in the NAFL. This usually involves things like sacks being awarded or taken away to individuals or teams, etc. The league needs to decide whether to accept these scoring changes, which could affect whether a team wins or loses in an individual week:

Please vote for your preference:

- 1) Scoring is made final on Tuesday at 12 noon Eastern time. If the NFL changes the scoring after, we don't let it change our scores.
- 2) We allow the NFL and league Web site to allow for scoring changes, which could affect a team's win/loss for that week.

### **Issue – Breaking Ties**

We need to avoid any tie-breaking issues that we had last year due to website limitations and with owners not putting in tie breaker players.

#### Proposal C – Tie Breaker Players

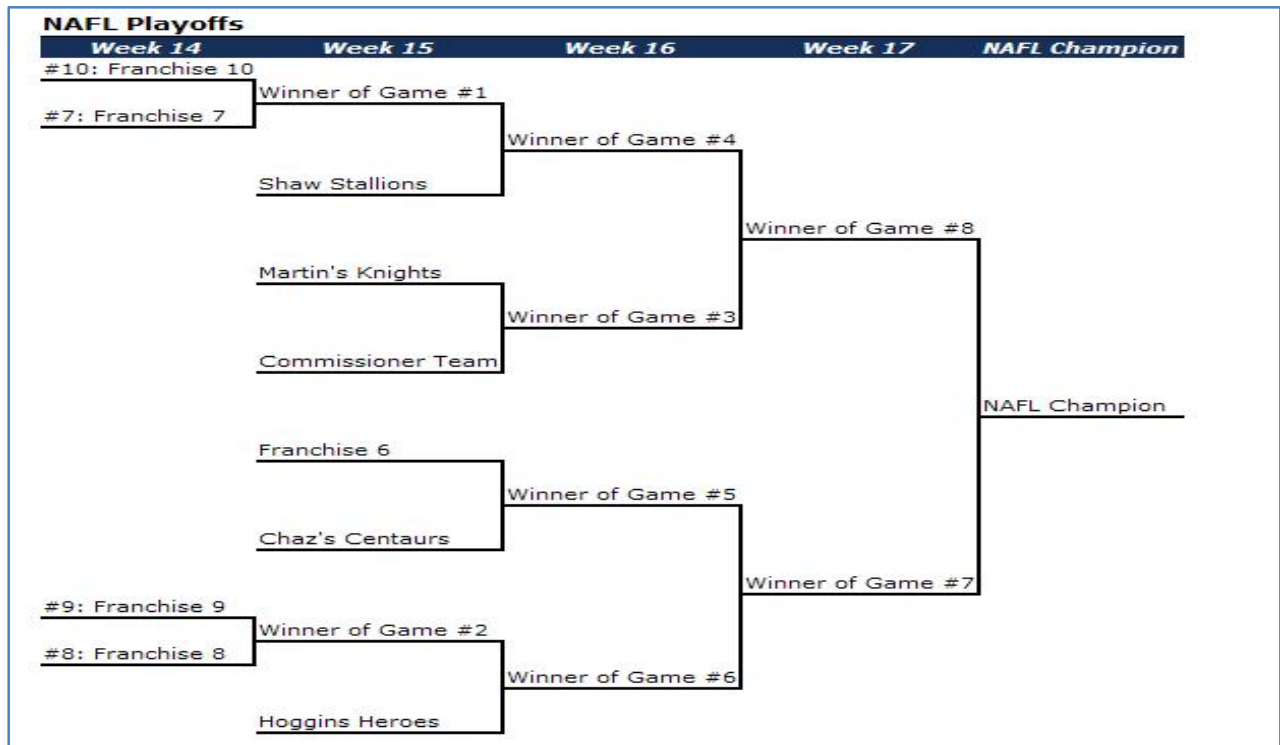
At least one player must be entered in as a tie-breaker player by each team owner. If a player is not entered in, they automatically lose the game if their game ends in a tie. We will no longer do carry-over players, or run an assumption on who the tie-breaker player will be.

### **Issue – Playoffs**

The NAFL is now at 14 teams and with a balanced schedule where every team plays everyone one time, the NAFL regular season will end at week 13. There is an opportunity to make a change to the NAFL playoff system in order to give more teams an opportunity to compete while giving teams that win the division and the other four top teams during the regular season an advantage. Otherwise, week 14 would just become another regular season game.

Proposal D – Increase the number of playoff teams to 10.

Increase the number of playoff teams to ten teams and give a bye to division winners and the remaining top four teams (six teams altogether). Week 14 would be the wild card weekend with last four teams playing to see who plays the two division winners. Weeks 15 – 17 would be the same as it is now. Prize money would not be affected with this change. Below is a sample bracket of what the playoffs could look like.



Issue – League Operations

Owners need to help in running the league with the following decisions.

Proposal E – NAFL Championship Game

Select an option for the location of the NAFL Championship Weekend.

- 1) Los Angeles Coliseum, Los Angeles, California = Owner's – Steve Foerstler & Kevin Reagan
